## ***Inspiring Engineers and Students by Keynote Speaker: Dr. Julio Guerrero, ASME President & a principal at Draper Laboratory***

**BIOGRAPHY:** Dr. Guerrero is a principal, R&D and business development, at Draper Laboratory in Cambridge, Mass., and President of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers, ASME. At Draper Laboratory, he identifies ways to apply the laboratory's technological capabilities and assets in the energy industry, including oil and gas exploration. Prior to joining Draper in 2011, Guerrero served as a principal research scientist for seven years at Schlumberger Research (SLB). An owner of nearly 20 patents worldwide.

**ABSTRACT:** Why do we participate in volunteering activities and organizations like ASME? That is the fundamental question that my presentation addresses. What makes us humans is that we can Love and Create. Engineering is connected to the second of these two. Most of us Love what we do and our profession. How do we inspire engineers and students worldwide to feel as we do about our profession and solutions we can CREATE for the human race?
